SWITZERLAND CHAPTER INFORMATION

The ISOC-CH Chapter in its current form had its inaugural General Assembly 22 April 2012, with 21 founding members. Currently we have 158 members throughout Switzerland and we are engaged in:

Q1: Rank Priorities for work items for ISOC-CH in 2014-15: 27 replies total

- Priority I: 14/27 people: Presence at technology events like Lift Conference
- Priority 2: 12/27 people: More local informal events to discuss ISOC ideas.
- Priority 3: I I/27 people: Hosting a national event on Swiss policy, governance, internet legislation.
- Priority 4: 10/27 people: Hosting a national privacy-focused event.
- Priority 5: 8 people each wanted two selections:
 More tool kits and papers on website about Internet Society issues.
 Collaborating with other chapters to share ideas

Q2: On Internet Issues, what are 5 most important issues to you, personally, in the list of ISOC issues. (number replies varied)

Very high or high priority 13/19 respondents indicated that Net Neutrality was highest prio for them personally.

Vey high or high 14/17 indicated privacy and identity.

Very high or high 11/14 indicated Internet Governance.

Very high or high 10/17 indicated Open Internet standards.



Q3: 18 replies: do you work in Internet Tech firm, or in a role directly involved with Internet technology, policy, implementation, or security?

Geneva-Lausanne region 39% or 7 people

Basel region 6% or I person

Bern region 17% or 3 people

Zurich region 39% or 7 people



Q4: 6 people indicated they would be interested in a role on the Board:

Vice Chair Internal: 33% or 2 people Vice Chair External: 66% or 4 people

Support local initiatives, at least in logistics.

As internet Policy-making is approaching a turning point at the end of this year and has been making the headlines around privacy and surveillance, it is important for the ISOC-CH chapter to be part of negotiations and discussions about securing the internet, protecting online communication from unwarranted interference, as well as adding internet to the post-2015 development agenda. In the upcoming discussions of the principles to be agreed on for global internet governance, the chapter can play a role, complementing its work at the national level.

We need to restore the free Internet. It has been a means of freeing the world, of enabling global communication and sharing. Now it has become a main means to control and manipulation.
